"Prodigies" ~ new and recent drawings by James Mundie

James Mundie's series of black and white ink drawings called "Prodigies" presents portraits of 'anomalous humans'— sometimes called 'monstrosities' or 'freaks'— in contexts borrowed from artworks of centuries past.

In the spirit of the sideshow, where even a three-legged man would be re-invented to appear more interesting, James Mundie has created new 'histories' for his subjects in which fact and fancy are liberally mingled. The resulting images are at once familiar, humorous, and startling.

"Prodigies" was originally intended as a series of etchings. True to that original vision but translated into a different form, James Mundie's layered pen strokes evoke the lush textures of aquatint and mezzotint.

James Mundie studied printmaking and painting at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, from which he graduated in 1995. James Mundie also attended the University of Pennsylvania, from which he received a BFA degree *magna cum laude* in 1997. His paintings, drawings and prints have been shown in numerous exhibitions, including venues in the United States, Japan, and Great Britain.
